**CHARCOAL IRON** 

Singapore Early or Mid 20th Century Cast Iron

A charcoal iron is a handheld piece of equipment with a flat surface. When heated, it is used to press clothes to remove creases.



**TENGKAT** 

Straits Settlements
Early or Mid 20th Century
Enamel

A tengkat is a food container, usually used for storing food, although the miniature variety was used in more unusual ways, from the serving of condiments such as belachan to the safekeeping of jewellery on a dressing table.



**MORTAR (BATU LESUNG)** 

Straits Settlements c. 1900 Granite

The mortar or batu lesung is used for crushing and pounding everything from candlenuts to lemongrass, breaking up large pieces and releasing flavours.
