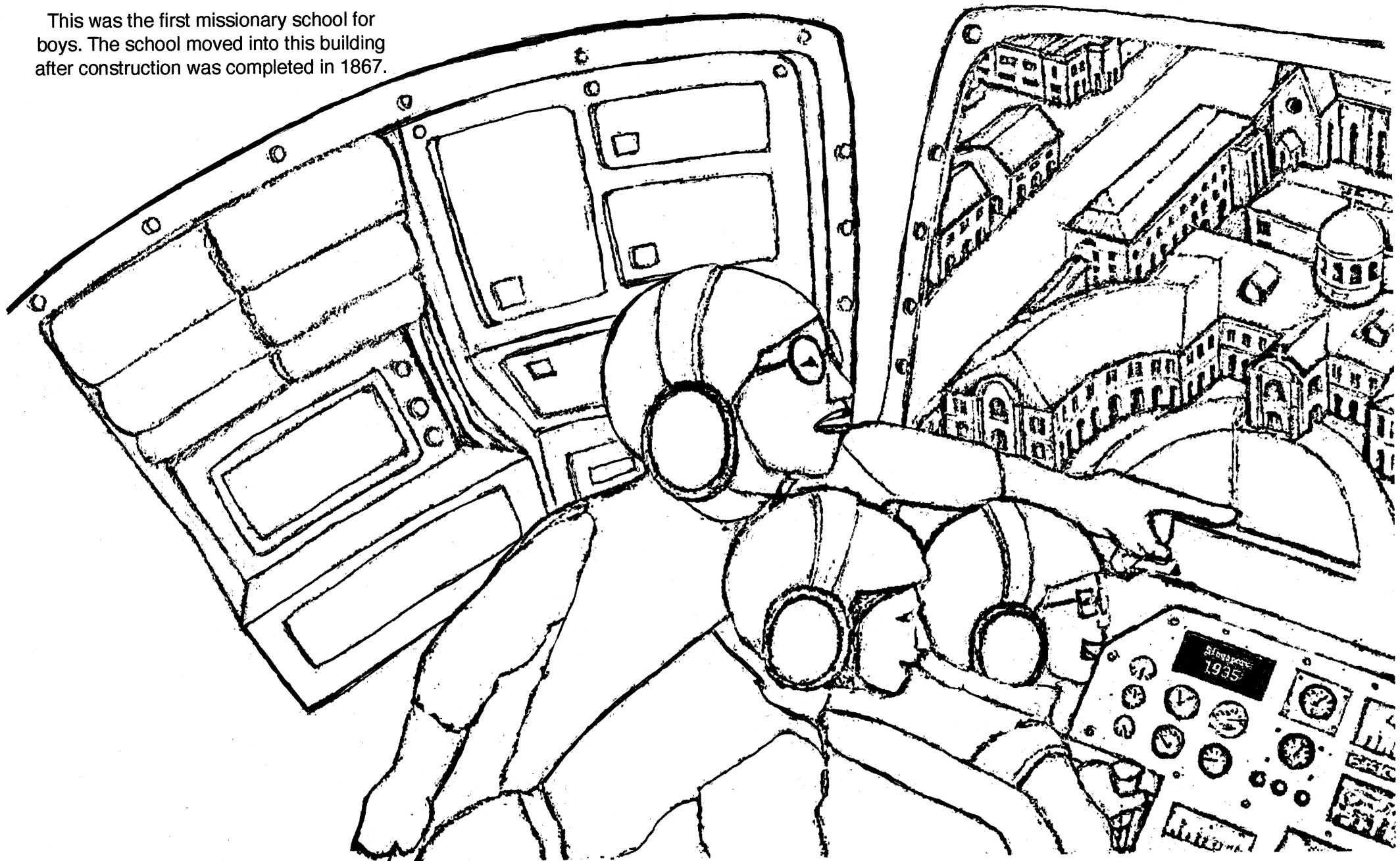


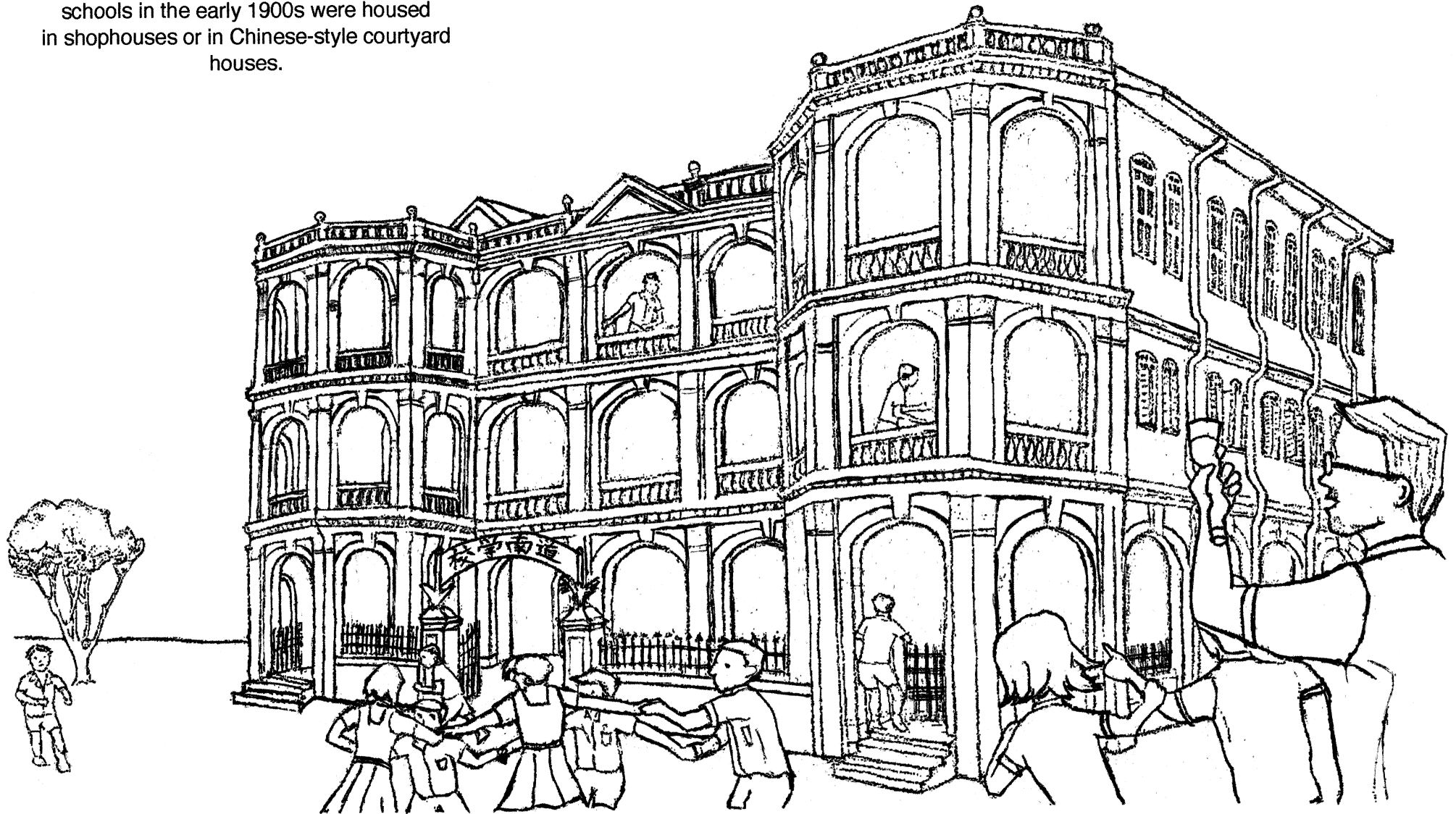
**Former St Joseph's Institution**  
**(now Singapore Art Museum)**

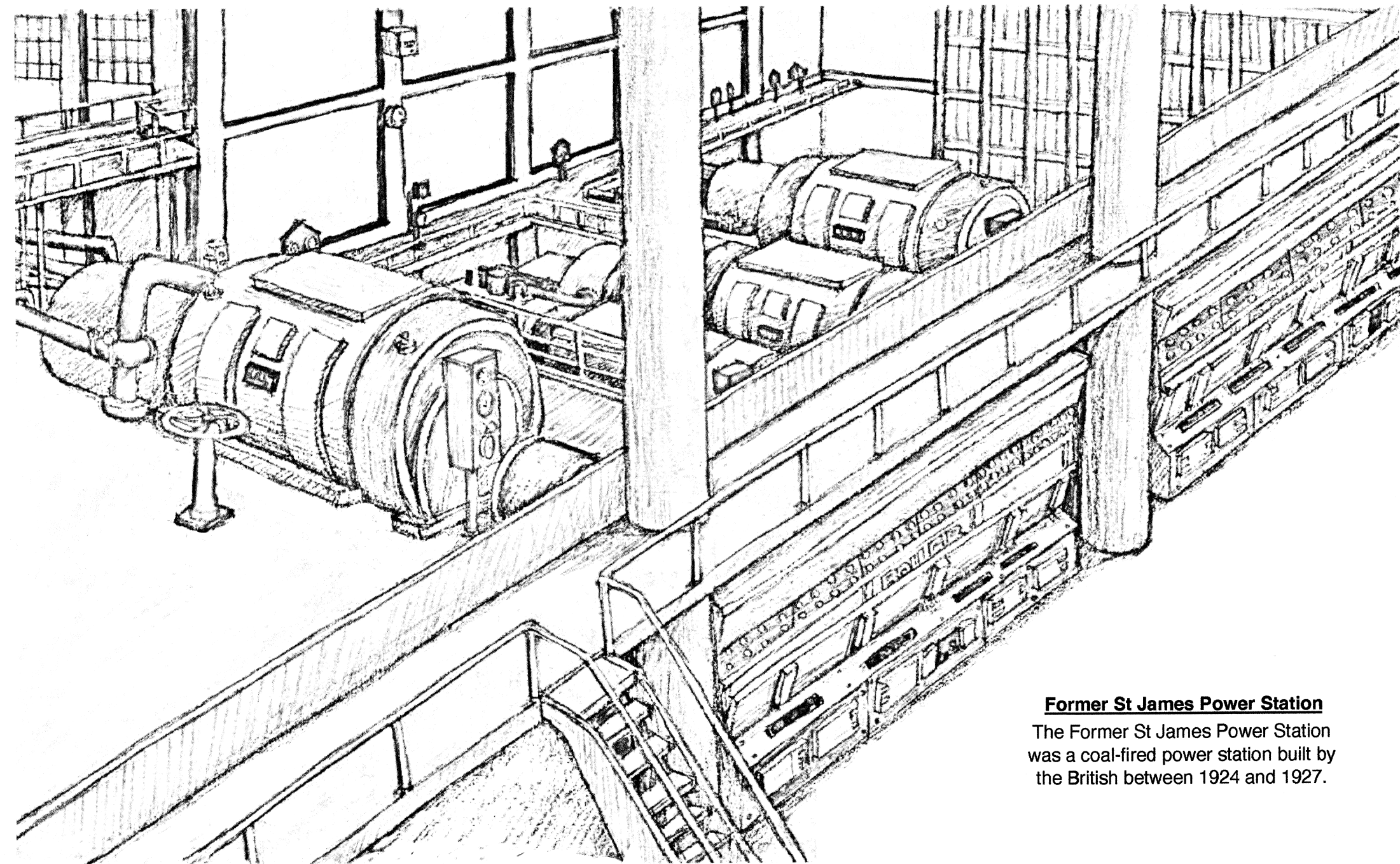
This was the first missionary school for boys. The school moved into this building after construction was completed in 1867.



**Former Tao Nan School**  
**(now the Peranakan Museum)**

Tao Nan School was the first Chinese school to be housed in a western-style building. Most schools in the early 1900s were housed in shophouses or in Chinese-style courtyard houses.





**Former St James Power Station**

The Former St James Power Station was a coal-fired power station built by the British between 1924 and 1927.

### Thian Hock Keng Temple

Thian Hock Keng Temple is one of the oldest and most important Hokkien temples in Singapore. It was built in 1842 by Chinese immigrants to thank the seafaring goddess Mazu whom they felt protected them from a dangerous and long sea journey across the South China Sea.
