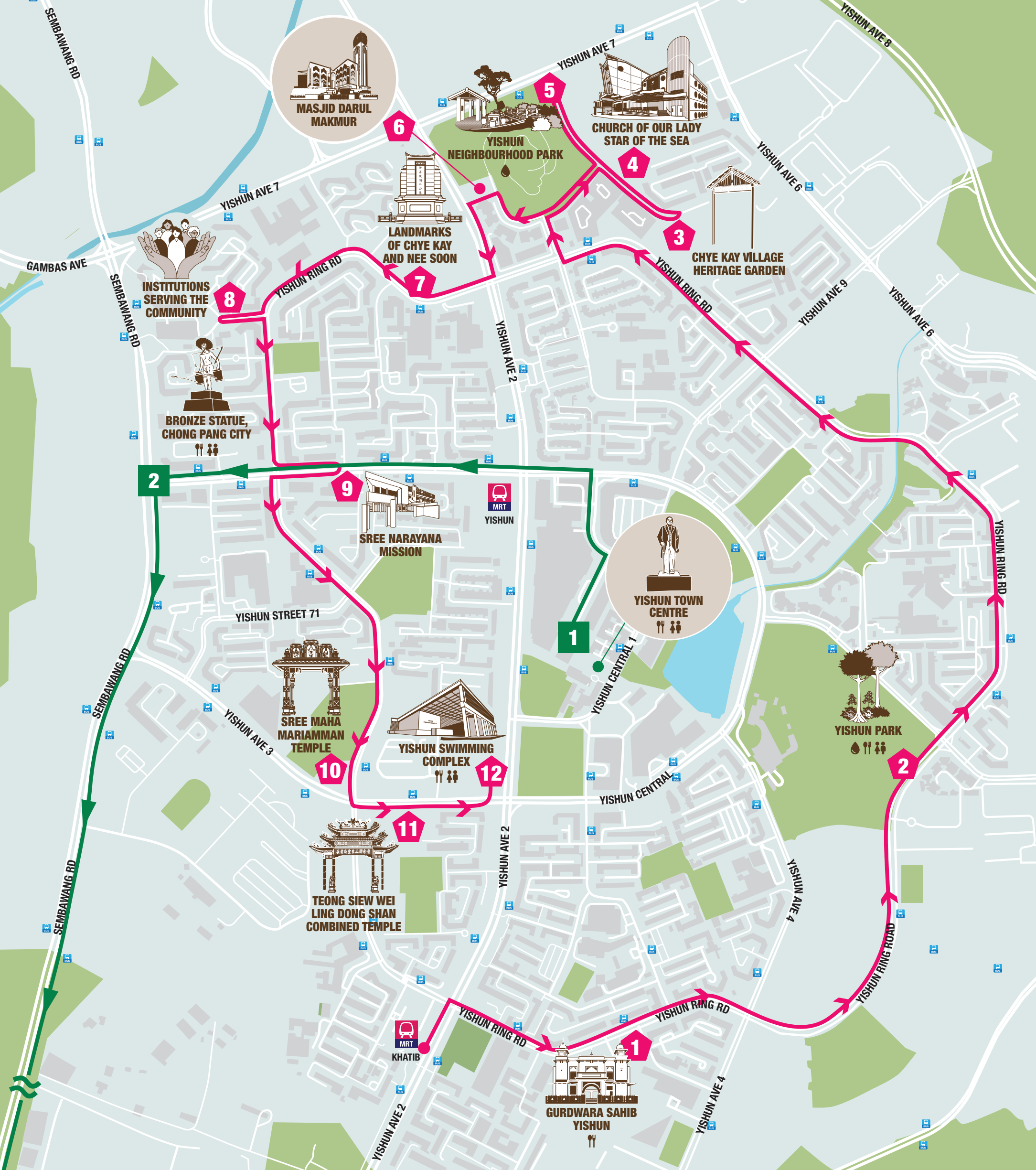
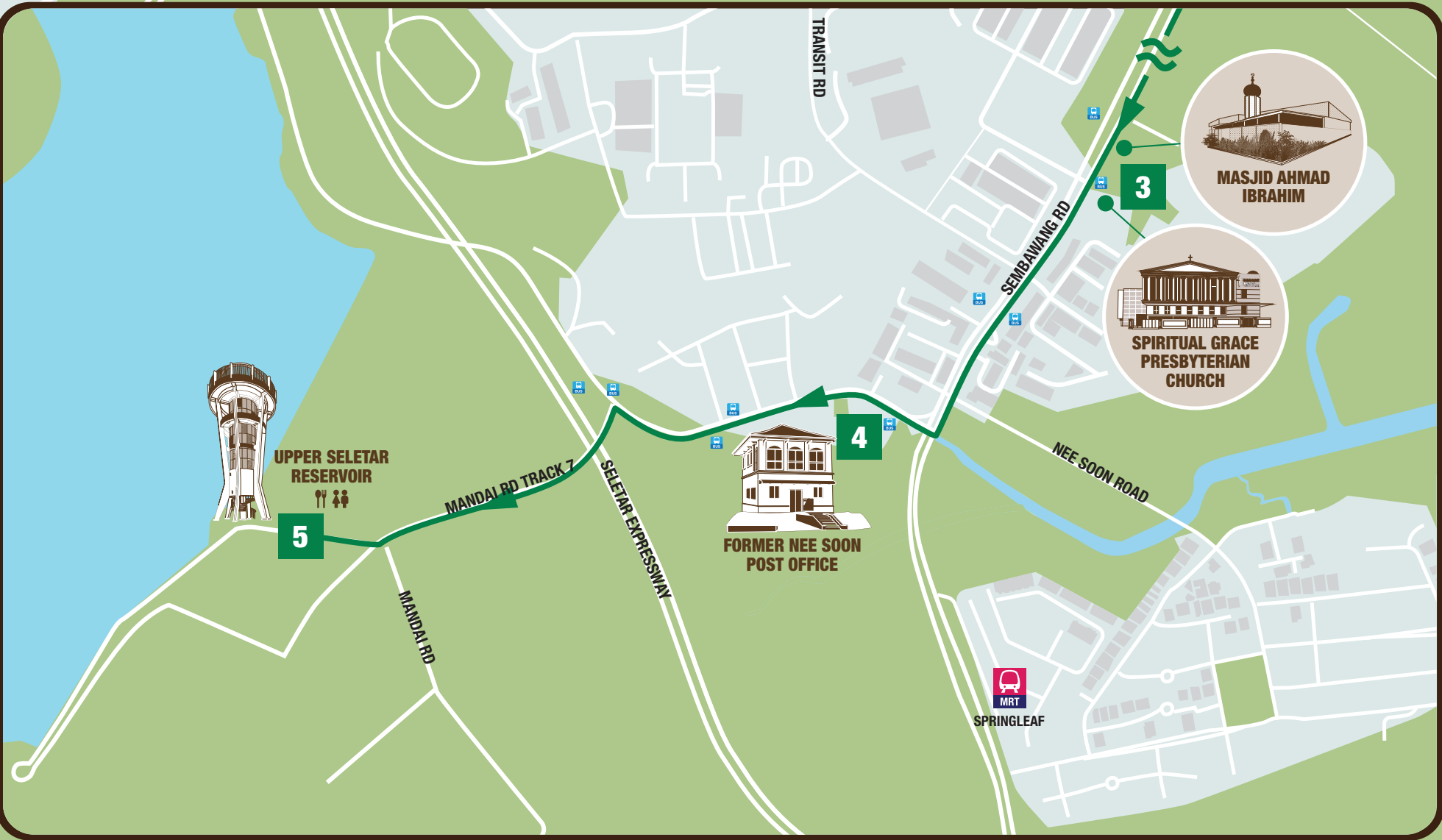

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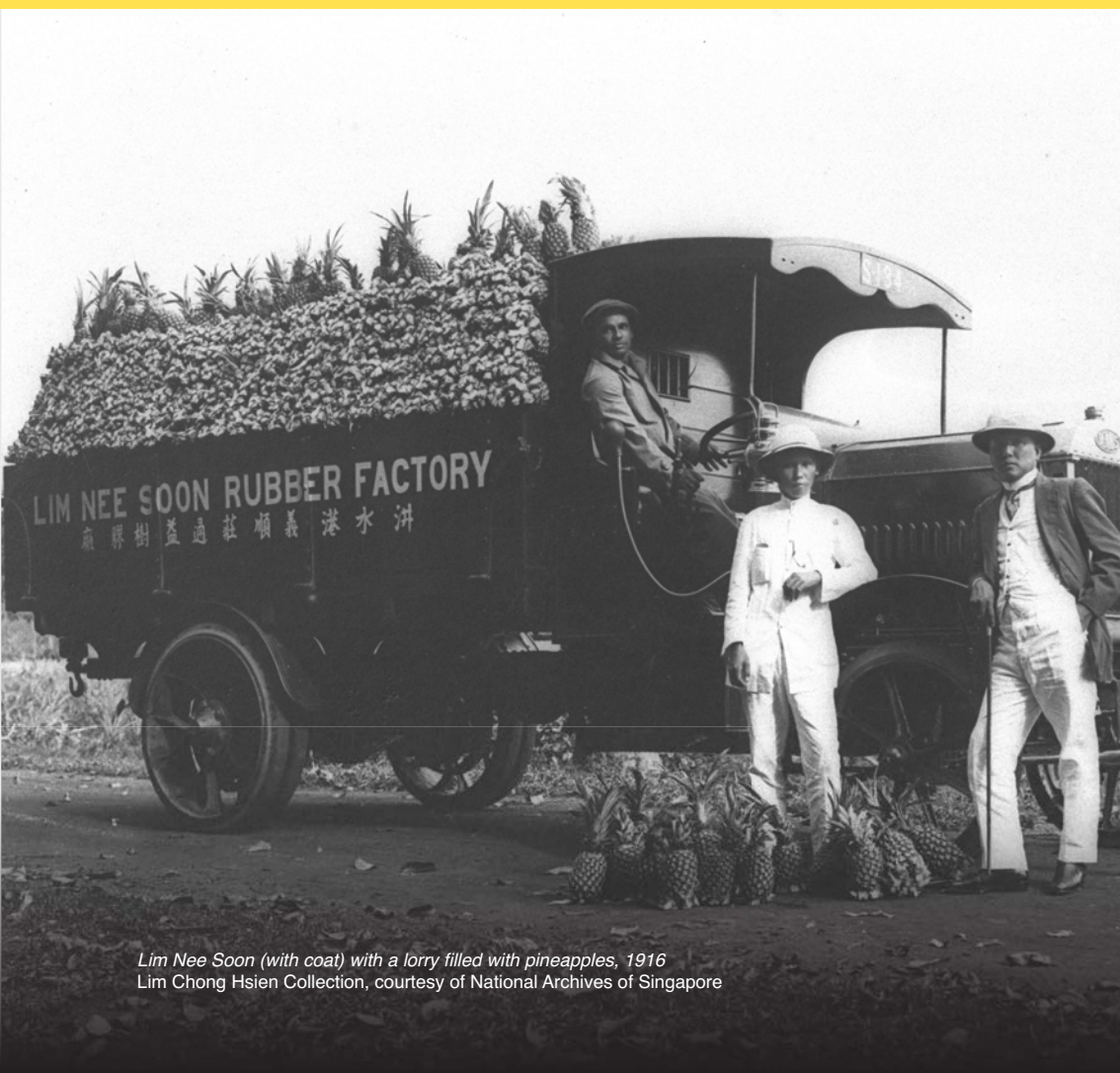
YISHUN HERITAGE TRAIL

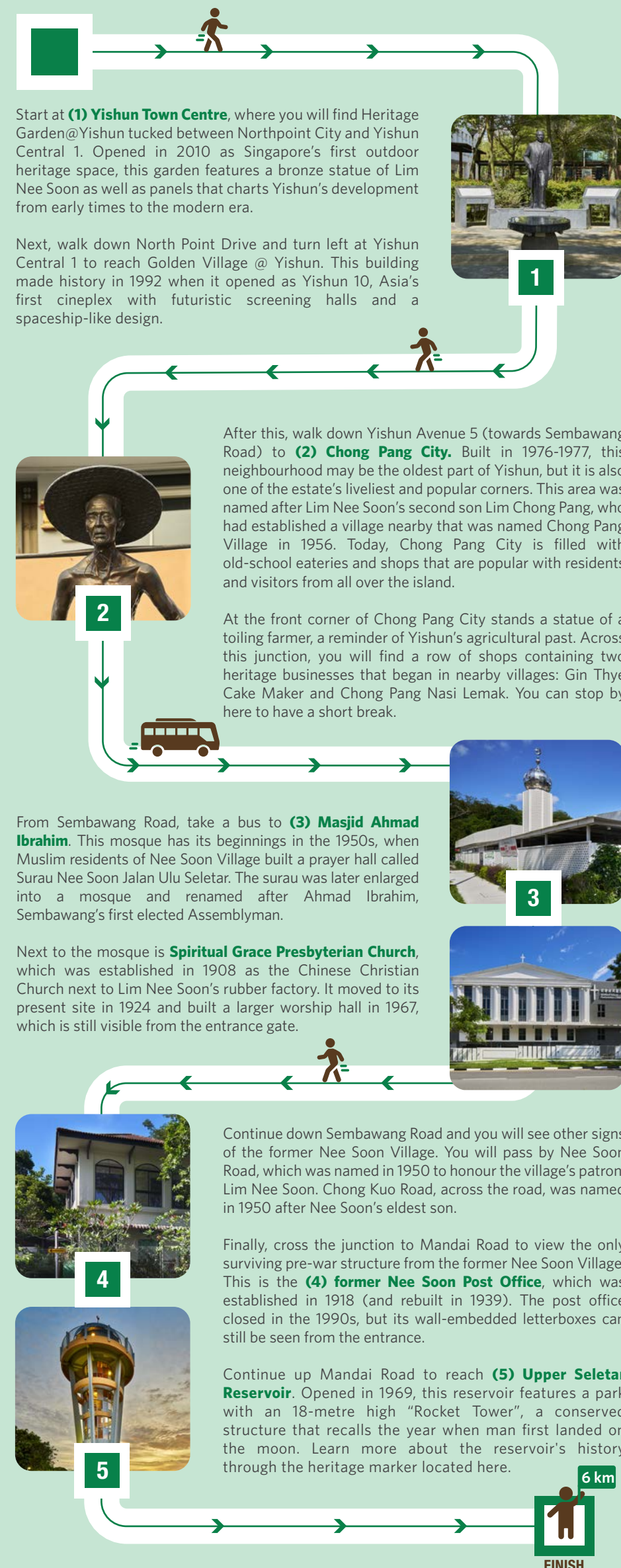
SUGGESTED SHORT TRAIL ROUTES

Think you know Yishun and the town's famous namesake Lim Nee Soon? There is much more to discover beyond pineapple and rubber plantations. These two thematic trails offer a journey to lesser-known corners of Yishun as well as the communities and landmarks from Nee Soon Village and Chye Kay Village, which make up the town we know today.

Rockets And Reservoirs

1 hour with public transport (6 km)

This is a journey back through time, from the spaceship-like architecture of the former Yishun 10 to landmarks from the former Nee Soon Village. This trail offers a tour of a town that was shaped by the legacy of its pioneer and namesake Lim Nee Soon.



Yishun Ring Route

2.5 hours with public transport (7.1 km)

Built in the early 1980s, Yishun Ring Road is a thoroughfare that connects residents to all corners of the town. Explore the Yishun Ring Route to discover its landmarks and attractions which make life convenient for residents and remind us of the area's past as a rural settlement called Chye Kay Village.
